Faux Fur	<i>“Faux fur:</i> from stoles and bloomers to coats and bra tops - seen across both ready-to-wear and accessories.”		<i>“Shearlings & Faux Furs:</i> vintage-inspired faux fur and shearling coats.”	<i>“The faux-fur takeover:</i> floor-length coats, cropped jackets, stoles, handbags, etc.”	<i>“Faux fur:</i> voluminous yeti-style coats, faux fur dresses.”
2. Structured Silhouettes	<i>“Suited and booted tailoring:</i> structured jackets and coats with nipped-in waistlines – no frills, no gimmicks, just immaculately cut.”		<i>“Sculpted Shapes:</i> jackets and coats with nipped waists, pieces with curved and sculptural silhouettes.”	<i>“Pencil skirt:</i> in lace/embellishments/bright colours. Styled with oversized knits, strapless bodices, and flouncy blouses.” / “The school shoe: brogues, loafers, chunky flats and patent slip-ons.”	<i>“Structured silhouettes:</i> bold shoulders, cinched waists, and exaggerated proportions.”

Sheer & Bare Looks	<i>“Undone elegance:</i> grown-up elegance underpinned by a sort of “undone-ness”, e.g. dress straps slipping off, loose layers being thrown on pell mell.”	<i>“Exposed Lingerie:</i> visible bras and underpinnings layered with sheer tops, or revealed under a blazer or jumpsuit, or peeking out from a shirt that slips off the shoulder.”		<i>“Dare to bare:</i> butt-baring gowns, barely-there slip dresses, and the sheer blouses.”	
4. Casual Luxe	<i>“Anti-algorithm dressing:</i> clothes that unpacked the idea of “feminine beauty”, further instilled with the undone “bedroom” hair.”	<i>“Elevated Loungewear:</i> good fabric, a silk set or luxurious robe, slip dress, silk robes —luxe fabrics.”			
5. Animal Prints				<i>“Leopard prints:</i> migrated from just outerwear to dresses, accessories, knitwear and skirt suits.”	<i>“Animal instincts:</i> leopard prints, snake prints, cow patterns.”
6. Edgy Leather	<i>“Punk:</i> tough leathers, cropped leather bombers, zipped-up bikers with matching trousers and patent T-bar heels.”		<i>“Heavy Metal Leathers:</i> Heavy, oversized leather jackets.”		
7. Belted Up				<i>“Unexpected belting:</i> oversized obi belts, skinny chain belts or double/triple belting.”	<i>“Belt pile-ups:</i> wide belts, or stacking multiple belts.”

Scarf & Draped Layers				<i>“Capey drapey coats:</i> capes or cape-inspired scarf coats that draped across the shoulders.”	<i>“Scarf details:</i> scarves and neck ties across everything from coats to knits to dresses - tied around the neck or built-in for a beautiful drape. In silk, wool or leather.”

Bold & Eye-Catching	<i>“Catchphrase:</i> wear your heart on your sleeve.”	<i>“Pattern Mix-and-Matching:</i> Power clashing—intentionally mixing different prints and patterns.”	<i>“Vibrant Shades:</i> bold, eye-catching colours meant to turn heads.”		<i>“Oversized bangles and bold bracelets:</i> reinforcing the trend for bold fashion choices.” / “Opera coats: long, sweeping coats layered over sleek evening wear or paired with structured tailoring.”

Statement Textures		<i>“Extra-Shiny Vinyl Textures</i> - looked extra slick and waterproof, in the form of trench coats, raincoats, and even floral dresses.”		<i>“Lovely Lace:</i> in both unexpected colour combinations and more neutral tones. Sleek lace slips, crochet lace gowns and lace-trimmed separates.”	<i>“Upholstery fabrics:</i> rich, textured materials that wouldn’t look out of place on a vintage armchair—but with a fashion-forward twist.”

Cozy & Feminine			<i>“Sweater Dressing:</i> Fair isle sweaters, sweater dresses.”	<i>“Soft, slouchy bags:</i> totes, clutches and cross-bodies in soft supple leathers and suede.”	<i>“Pretty bows:</i> doll-like bows appearing across collars, down the fronts of dresses, and as delicate jacket ties.” / “Pouffy skirts: Layers of tulle, ruffles, and puffed-up hemlines.”
